

Olivia is a planner like most of




our kids, she has been watching every move the adults in the dance group do. She has made it known that she will be dancing one day with her instructors.

Recently, I had the privilege of spending some time with Dean Plon – the oldest person with PWS that PWSA of WI, Inc has on record in their database. It was a joy and an honor being able to talk with him and reminisce about "old times". Dean turned 60 years old on his last birthday. For the most part, Dean remains healthy and active. He is an engaging, bright man who is very willing to share his memories and experiences.

Dean and I talked a bit about baseball. For those of you who know me, baseball has become a personal and family favorite topic. Dean shared his memories of the Milwaukee Braves. He told me how sad he was when they moved to Atlanta. He talked about going to games at Milwaukee County Stadium. He told me he continues to be a Brewer fan however he still has a special place in his heart for the Braves.

I asked Dean what he is doing now that he is retired. He shared that he continues to attend a program at the Madison Area Rehabilitation Center (MARC). "On some days I still do a little work. On other days we get to go on trips — out for coffee and shopping". Dean has been a volunteer at a voting site for years. In the last election, he got paid as well. I asked him if he likes his life these days and he smiled and said "yes".

One thing he did share that has been hard is that both of his parents have died. He still has a guardian that helps him with decisions; however I could see on his face that this loss was something he still grieves.

About one year ago, Dean and his long-time housemate moved in to a different duplex where he continues to receive 24 hour support from the staff of Community Living Connections. Dean shared that he really likes this home better than his previous one and he is very pleased with the support and help he receives from his staff. Dean has always taken pride in contributing to making his home look nice. He has loved to mow the lawn in the summer and shovel the snow in the winter.

I have known Dean for many years. He may have a few more wrinkles but he still has that twinkle in his eye and a sense of humor that I hope will continue for many years to come.
